This INDENTURE made this twenty fourth day of
 September one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight
 Between Benjamin Gray of the county of Southampton of the
 one part and Benjamin Gray (son of the said Benjamin Gray)
 of the other part witnesseth that the said Benjamin Gray
 for and in consideration of the love and tender regard that
 the said Benjamin Gray hath for his said son Benj.
 Gray hath given, granted, Alain'd cuffebo & confined
 unto the said Benjamin Gray his heirs and assigns for
 ever one certain tract or parcel of land, two hundred &
 one quarter acres (at being the land and Plantation Bay:
 Gray now living) be the same more or less bounded as
 follows To wit: Beginning at the sweet house swamp at
 an ake thence Lazarus Cook's line to a lightwood post
 a corner thence along a line still binding on said
 Cook's line to a post oak standing on John Kindred's
 line thence along Kindred's line to a pine a corner tree
 of Ephraim Faircloth thence along said Faircloth line
 to a Maple standing in Powell's Branch a corner of
 said Faircloth line three down the said Branch to the
 Middle Sweet house swamp thence down the main
 river
