This Indenture made this Eleventh day of January, in the year of our Lord Christ, One Thousand seven hundred & Ninety nine Between Josiah Vick & Elizabeth his wife of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia of the one part and Benjamin Johnston of the same County & State of Virginia of the other part Witnesseth that the said Josiah Vick & Elizabeth his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of eight hundred and thirty three Spanish Milled Silver dollars, then in hand paid by the said Benjamin Johnston at and before the signing sealing & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Josiah Vick & Elizabeth his wife doth hereby acknowledge & themselves thereunto fully satisfied have bargain sold & conveyed sole absolute & perfect Confirmation and by these presents doth hereby bargain sell & convey unto the said Benjamin Johnston his heirs & assigns & certain tract & plantation or parcel of land lying & situate in the said County of Southampton & Parish of St. Mary on Flagg run Swamp adjoining the lands of William Clarke George Washington William Barnes & William Cuthbert being the same tract of land that the said Josiah Vick purchased of William Johnston (as the same is estimated two hundred acres by the same men or persons as followed tract & lying along at a White Oak
