This Indenture

made this first day of May in the Year
of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and ninety Nine, Between Sam
Wilkinson of the County of Southampton of the one part, and William Piper
of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said James
Wilkinson for and in consideration of the sum of Six hundred and eleven
pounds which is hereby acknowledged, by the said James Wilkinson
having granted bargain'd, sold, alien'd, enfeoff'd and confirm'd and by
these presents doth grant bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and confirm unto
the said William Piper his heirs and assigns, two certain Tracts or
parcels of land, the one containing one hundred and twenty two
half acres and bounded as follows (to wit) beginning at a stone in the
Little Swamp a corner in the Newtons line thence along a line of
marked trees to a small hickory a corner in the Esham Thicket line
thence to the main Road leading from Boffens bridge to the Cape
Road, thence along the said Road to Russell Bayants line, thence
along the said Bayants line to the Little Swamp of a corner - thence
down the said swamp to the beginning - The other Tract containing
sixty acres and bounded as follows (to wit) beginning at a small hickory
in a line, thence to Benjamin Gaugs line in a small Swamp
