

And upon the said Calvert paying up to her? Trustees, the above sum of one hundred pounds with the Interest that may accrue thereon as aforesaid, that then the said Samuel Calvert is to release the said Lands & every of the appurtenances as fully & as amply as if this Deed had never been made; but until the said Calvert shall faithfully pay the above one hundred pounds & the lawfull Interest as aforesaid; the said Lands & premises shall ever be liable to the security of the same. Witnesseth that the said Sarah Norm & Sarah his wife formerly Sarah Harris for and satisfaction of the sum of Forty pounds Current Money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Humphrey Drury at and before the sealing & delivering of these presents, the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge; and from every part thereof do acquit and discharge the said Humphrey Drury. Have granted bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do and each of them with great bargain and will alien, convey & confirm to the said Humphrey Drury his heirs and assigns all their the said Jacob Norm & Sarah his wife's right title interest claim property or demand whithersoever the same have in or to the south side of the three creeks commonly called the Great creeks Containing by a late survey by Leonard and seventy four acres being the same land mentioned in the Will of Amos Harris Dec^d as containing four hundred & twenty two more or less and devised by the said Amos Harris in his said Will to be equally divided between William & West Harris
