or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid containing by
Estimation one hundred and twelve acres be the same more or less, and
as by a report of the Commissioners appointed by the Court of South Carolina
for the purpose of Dividing the Land of S^c Dec^r of Joseph Atkinson and himself
