

Know all men by these presents that I William Browne of Southampton county for and in consideration of the sum of twenty Dollars to me in hand paid at the sealing of these presents by Thomas Browne of the county aforesaid The receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, have bargained, sold and by these presents do bargain and sell unto the said Thomas Browne one mans saddle one pot one frying pan one pair of Iron wedges other trifles too tedious to mention one Dark Bay mare three feather Beds & furniture one cow one pair cattle wheels one save one shirt one hand saw two Drawing Knives two grubbing hoes To have and to hold the said granted premises unto the said Thomas Browne to him and to his Heirs forever by these presents Bargained and sold, unto the said Thomas Browne his Executors Administrators and assigns for ever & I the said William Browne for my self my Heirs Executors Administrators, the said Mentioned articles. Unto the said Thomas Browne his Executors Administrators & assigns against me the said William Browne my Executors Administrators & assigns, and against all and every other person & persons whatsoever shall and will warrant, aid, defend or defend by these presents of which - I the said William Browne have put the said Thomas Browne in full possession in writing whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this day of 1200
