This Indenture made this 17 day of February in the year of our
Lord one thousand Eight hundred between Frederick Robertson of
the one part, James Barnes of Second part and Jordan Vick and
Thomas Brown of the third part, all of the county of Southampton
Wiltshire that whereas the said Frederick Robertson stands justly
Indebted to the said James Barnes by a writing obligatory under his
hand and Seal bearing equal with these presents in the sum of one
hundred & Twenty pounds, with Interest from the first day of January
1797 to be paid on or before the first day of January Eight hundred
and whereas for the further assurance and securing the payment
aforesaid, it is agreed by the said Frederick Robertson and James
Barnes that a conveyance Interest shall be made to the said
Vick & Thomas Brown for the benefit of the said James Barnes as in
the said writing obligatory should not be paid with Interest as before
now this Indenture therefore witnesseth that the said Frederick
Robertson for & in consideration of the premises aforesaid & for
the further consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in
hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath given
tid bargain & sold shined released and confirm and confirmed
presently doth for himself his heirs Executors and administrators
Vain and full alien make over and confirm unto the said
Vick & Thomas Brown, and to his heirs Executors administrators
assigns a certain tract or plantation & parcel of land situate (lying)
