To all People to whom these presents shall come I John Boykin
do send greeting. Know ye that I the said John Boykin of the
parish of St. Luke in the county of Southampton Planter for and in
Consideration of the Love, goodwill and affection which I have and
do bear towards my loving son Arthur Boykin of the same parish
and county, have given and granted and by these presents do fully
give and grant unto the said Arthur Boykin his heirs Executors or
Administrators, a certain tract of Land formerly belonging to Joseph
Taylor which bounds may be found by applying to the deed that
is in the office of the said tract of Land lying in the parish
aforesaid of which (before the signing of these presents) I have
delivered the said tract of Land unto the said Arthur Boykin
To have and to hold the said tract of Land unto the said Arthur Boykin
to him the said Arthur Boykin his heirs Executors or administrators
from henceforth as his proper Right absolutely without any
of conditions In Witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand
and Seal this fifth day of February one thousand Eight hundred
