 parcel thereof, and the said William Pope and Fanny his wife
 for themselves their heirs Executors and administrators will forever
 warrant and defend the fee simple bright and title of the s^d
 Land and premises unto the said John Moore his heirs and assigns
 forever in witness whereof the said William Pope and Fanny
 his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day
 and year first above written.
