

Swamp to another white oak a corner of the S<sup>r</sup>. Lane i.e.  
Hardy Johnsons line then the said Hardy Johnsons (said of it  
William Johnsons) line to a red oak in the new line that  
divides it from Burwell Williams land and that line to  
Mary Williams during her life or widowhood and then to  
George Williams the most of the manor plantation containing one  
hundred eighteen & half acres of land and bounded as follows begin-  
ning in the hogpen branch at a pine in the aforementioned  
Eley Williams line then up the branch to a white oak near the  
head thereof a corner of the said land, then a line of newly mar-  
ked trees which divides this tract from the lands herein allotted  
to Lion Williams to a white oak in the head of a small branch  
down the branch to another branch and down that to the stool  
bridge swamp and down the said swamp to a white oak then  
a line of newly marked trees which divides the said land from  
Eley Williams land to the beginning. To Lion Williams one hun-  
dred and eighteen acres of land bounded as follows (to wit)  
beginning at a white oak in the south prong of the hogpen bran-  
ch in the aforesaid George Williams line then down the branch  
by the said George Eley and Burwell Williams lines to the  
line that was Titus Fowlers then the said line to Drewry  
Williams formerly John Williams line & the said line  
to the mouth of a small branch in George Williams line and  
his line up the branch and a line of new marked trees  
to the beginning.
