This Indenture made this nineteenth day
of May in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred
between Thomas Wood of the county of Southampton
executor of the last will and testament of Drewry Pond dec^d
of the one part and John Morris of the county of Dorset of
the other part - Witnesseth that the said Thomas Wood
Executor of the will of Drewry Pond dec^d aforesaid
for and in the consideration of the sum of Twenty five
pounds and six pence unto him in hand paid by the
John Morris the receipt whereof the said Thomas Wood
doth hereby acknowledge and thereof, and every parcel and part
thereof doth fully, clearly and absolutely acquit exonerate and
discharge the said John Morris his heirs executors and admin-
istrators by these presents he the said Thomas Wood executor
aforesaid hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released,
enjoyed, and confirmed; and by these presents doth grant let
sell, alien, release, enjoy, and confirm unto the S^r John
Morris his heirs and assigns forever, one tract or parcel of
Land, being part of the Lands of which the aforesaid Drewry
Pond dec^d did seized and possessed and bring that parcel
directed by the will of the S^d Drewry Pond dec^d to be sold
and conveyed as followeth to wit Beginning at a white oak
in the reedy Branch on Browns Road thence south with the
