 Wiltshers that the afore said Trustees in the consideration of the
 sum of one hundred pounds Lawful money of Virginia in hand
 paid, have given granted bargained sold and released and by these
 presents do give grant bargain sell and release unto the said Samuel
 Calvert and his heirs a certain tract or parcel of Land in the county
 of Southampton being the same place whereon the said
 Samuel now lives containing by Estimation four hundred and
 thirty two acres be the same more or less which Tract or parcel of
 Land was conveyed to us by deed of bargain, sale and Mortgage
 made on the seventeenth day of June in the year one thousand
 seven hundred and ninety nine and is of record in the county
 court of Southampton as on reference will fully appear
 To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with its
 appurtenances exempt from all claims, demands or incum-
 brances on our part unto him the said Samuel Calvert and
 his heirs, and the foresaid Trustees for themselves and each of
 them and their successors in office in virtue of the Law in such
 case made and provided and also for their heirs executors and
 administrators the said tract or parcel of land with its appur-
 tenances to him the said Samuel Calvert his heirs and assigns
 do, shall, and will forever release. In witness whereof the
