

Samuel Calvert and wife hath granted bargained and sold
enfeoff^d and confirm unto the said parks Nick his heirs &
yours forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing
Thirty seven acres be the same more or less situated lying and
being on the north side of the Cramptons branch bounded
as follows vizt beginning at a black gum in mid Cramptons
branch & in the glibe line thence along the glibe line 8^{ft} 6ⁱⁿ 826
pole a hickory side the road called the wolfpit road thence along
the hicks line 8^{ft} 6ⁱⁿ pole a white oak thence 8^{ft} 6ⁱⁿ 32 pole
