of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded.

This Indenture made this third day of January
in the year one thousand eight hundred Between Lawrence
Joyner and wife of Southampton County of the one
part and Henry Suiter of the aforesaid County of the other
part Witnesseth that the said Lawrence Joyner for &
in consideration of the sum of forty eight pounds ten shilling
to them in hand paid by the said Henry Suiter the Rec.
Whereof the said Lawrence Joyner & wife hath granted &
acknowledged they the said Lawrence Joyner & wife hath
granted bargain sold aliened enoffed and by these presents
doth grant bargain and sell alien enoff and confirm unto
the said Henry Suiter one certain Tract or parcel of Land
containing ninety seven acres be the same more or less situate
lying and being in the county of Southampton on the
North side of Black Creek Beginning at a Lightwood post
a corner of Lawrence Joyners and the Warrell Land thence S.
89° W 120 poles a corner maple in Black Creek Swamp thence
the courses of said swamp downwards to a corner
pine in Wm Rayfords line thence along Rayfords line
leaving the said swamp N. 15° W a corner pine thence S.
81° W a new line of marked trees to the beginning Lightwood
Stake Containing 97 acres it being a part of Lawrence
Joyners land and which his son Lawrence bought by a decree of
the court of said County and also all trees woods underwoods
