This Indenture made This 20 day of October in the
year of our Lord Christ Eighteen hundred Between William Bailey
and wife Elizabeth of the county of Southampton of the one part and
Henry Driggs son of Charles Driggs of the same county of the other
part Witnesseth that the said William Bailey and wife Elizabeth
for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars to them
in hand paid at or before the Enacting and delivery of these presents
the receipt of which and themselves fully satisfied contented and
performed do hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained & sold
aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain
& sell unto the said Henry Driggs his heirs and assigns forever all our
right of power &c. in and to a certain tract of Land containing by
estimation nine hundred and fifty five acres more or less (in the
county of Southampton) being formerly the property of Sam Driggs decd
of which the now said Elizabeth Bailey had ought to hold one third
share during her natural life as belet of the said Samuel Driggs
and now the said William Bailey become equally possessed
