This Indenture made this 14<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred Between James Ramsey and his Wife Sally of Southampton county of the one part and Henry Smith of said county of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Ramsey and his Wife Sally for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred & thirty pounds Virginia money to them in hand paid by the said Henry Smith the receipt whereof the said James Ramsey and his wife doth hereby acknowledge & thereof doth acquit the said Henry Smith his heirs executors admors & assigns forever by these presents hath granted bargained sold alien released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release & confirm unto the said Henry Smith his heirs and assigns forever one certain Tract or parcel of Land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing one hundred and Fifty acres of Land more or less and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a sweet gum in a branch a corner tree of Francis thence along said Francis line South eighty five degrees east fifteen pole to a scrub oak a corner of Newton Land thence along said Newton line South six degrees east one hundred and eighty pole to a pine thence forty six & a half degrees east ninety pole to a red oak in Cleftons line thence along said Cleftons line South fifty degrees West one hundred and fifty two pole to a pine thence North ten degrees West forty pole to a pine thence North sixty two degrees West two pines chapt in said Smiths own line thence along said line North twenty seven degrees West two hundred and twenty one pole to a pine thence South seventy eight degrees East by right pole to a red Oak thence down a branch fifty two degrees to a gum thence South eighty five degrees east forty pole to an Oak thence South seventy seven degrees East forty eight pole to the beginning Together with all houses outbuildings
