This Indenture made this fifteenth day of
October in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred
Between Joseph Wright and Nancy his wife of South
ampton County of one part and John Wright of the
aforesaid County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Jo-
seph Wright and Nancy his wife for and in consideration of the
Sum of Thirty pounds Current Money to them in hand paid
by the said John Wright before the sealing and delivery of these presents
to the receipt whereof the said Joseph Wright and Nancy his wife
doth hereby acknowledge themselves fully satisfied and paid
and thereof doth acquit and discharge the said John Wright and
hath hereby bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed & confirmed
by these presents forever ourselves our heirs Executors and ad-
ministrators with us and John Wright any son his heirs Executors adminis-
trators our certain tract or parcel of Land lying &
being on the North Side of Seacocks Swamp in Malloway
parish in the county of aforesaid and bounded as follows Beginning
at a gum standing in Seacock from thence along a line of
which trees to Tines Line up the said Tines to a Turkey Oak
from thence along a line of marked trees to a pine Thence
the New Road to the deep branch down the deep branch to
the run of Seacock thence down the said run to the first station
the same containing one hundred Acres of Land more or less
also the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders To
have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with all and
singular its rights and appurtenances therunto belonging or in
any wise appertaining — The said John Wright his heirs and
assigns forever in as full ample manner to all Interest and
