 said William Start depart this life before Eliza his wife
 having so far fulfilled the Contract then shall the said
 Eliza at her option retain the said Negroes during her
 natural life or widowhood by doing what the said
 Start is hereby bound to do But at the death or second
 marriage of the said Eliza then shall all the said
 Negroes with their increase be the absolute property
 of the aforesaid Polly Start & heirs forever And whereas
 life is uncertain be it further remembered that should
 the said William and Eliza Start both depart this life
 the said Pramble Hunnicutt then in that case shall
 the representative of the said Start Estate him out the
 said Negroes or so many as will be sufficient to purchase such
 necessaries of life as the Pramble Hunnicutt may stand
 in need of for her Bodily support during life, In Testimony
