This Indenture made this 27 day of August in the year of
Christ 1800 Between Benjamin Edwards Brown and Mary Mason his
wife of the County of Surry, of the one part, and Edward Faulcon — of the same
County of the other part, witnesseth that the said Benjamin E. Brown
and Mary Mason his wife for selling and assuming the lands
and premises herein after mentioned unto such uses and
purposes as are herein after expressed and declared; and for
and in consideration of the sum of one dollar of lawful money of vir-
ginia to them the said Benjamin E. Brown and Mary Mason his
wife in hand paid by the said Edward Faulcon — at or before
the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged) they the said Ben^g E. Brown and Mary
Mason his wife, have and each of them have granted, warranted
sold and confirmed & by these presents do and each of them
doth grant bargain, sell and confirm unto the said Edward
Faulcon — his heirs and assigns all that tract or parcels of
land and the first mill situate, lying and being in the
