of land whereon he now lives, containing eight hundred &
fifty three acres, more or less and bounded by the ancient—
known and standing line of the of the said Tract or parcel of
land. So have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with
the appurtenances thereto belonging or any ways appertaining, to
the only proper use and behoof of him the said Richard Blunt
and to his Heirs for ever, and I the said Benjamin Blunt for my
self and my Heirs do by these presents, make over and quit all claim
or title that I now have, to, and in the said tract or parcel of
land unto the said Richard Blunt and to his Heirs for ever
