 in hand, paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath  
 given, granted, bargained, and sold and these presents doth  
 give, grant, bargain, and sell, unto the said Jefse Crocker and  
 his Heires, all that tract, or parcel of Land in remainder which  
 the said Jefse Crocker and Polly his wife conveyed to him by Deed  
 of Mortuery, bargain and sale, bearing date the first day of  
 March eighteen hundred and One, as on reference thereto  
 being here will fully appear containing three hundred and  
 seven acres and one sixth part of an acre be the same more or  
 less lying in the county of Southampton aforesaid To have  
 and to hold the said tract or parcel of land as in the aforesay  
 tioned and described, to him the said Jefse Crocker and his Heires  
 and the said W. Elchisdele, for himself, his heirs Executors  
 and Administrators, the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land  
 with its appurtenances in remainder, unto him the said Jefse  
 Crocker against all persons claiming under or from the  
 said W. Elchisdele will release and forever defend In witness
