 having under my care one Negro man Jack aged between
 forty five and fifty, Years whom I have heretofore held as a
 Slave and being well pleased with his faithful services
 and good behaviour it is my desire that he shall have his
 freedom I do therefore emancipate and set him free: I
 do for my self my heirs Executors and administrators Re-
 linquish all my right title interest and claim or
 pretensions of Claim whatsoever: either to his person or to
 any estate he may hereafter acquire and the above
 named Negro to enjoy his full freedom without any
 interruption from me or any person Claiming for
 by or under me - In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this fourteenth day of March
 Eighteen Hundred and one —
