This Indenture made this fifth day of May 1801 Between

George Gurly & Mary his wife of the county of Hampton and State of

Virginia of the one part and Stephen Hancock of the county and

State aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth, that the said George

Gurly & Mary his wife for and in consideration of the sum of

one hundred and five Dollars to them in hand paid by the said

Stephen Hancock before the sealing and delivery of these presents the

said George Gurly & Mary his wife hereby acknowledge, & thrust and therefrom do ac-

quit and discharge the said Stephen Hancock by these presents, and

hereupon have bargained, sold and delivered, and by these presents do

bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Stephen Han-

cock his heirs & assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying

and being in the county aforesaid containing by estimation twenty

one acres more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning

at a gum in Dick's swamp thence East by North twenty one

poles to a pine, thence North East by East one hundred & twenty eight

poles to a pine thence North twenty degrees West forty and

two thirds poles to a light wood pole thence by a line of marked

tree to the beginning. With all woods underwoods & swamps
