peaceable possession and seizen of the land within mention as was given
and Delivered by the within named Benjamin Jordan & Mournig
his wife to the within named Pilgrim Wick to hold to him his
Heirs and assigns according to the true intent and meaning of the
within Deed —

At a court held for the county of Southampton the 18th day of May 1801 —

This Indenture was acknowledged by Benjamin Jordan and Mournig
his wife she being first, privately examined as the law directs and ordered
to be recorded —

Witnessed this 6th of May one thousand eight hundred
and one between Christian Wick Pilgrim Wick and Lydia his wife
Benjamin Jordan & Mournig his wife and Jacob Wick on the
one part and John Rawls on the other part each of Southampton County —
Witnesseth that the said Christian Pilgrim & Lydia Wick Benjamin
Jordan & Mournig Jordan & Jacob Wick, for and in consideration of
the sum of one hundred and seventy pounds current money of Virginia
on demand have given and confirmed and by these Presents do
give grant and confirm unto the said John Rawls his heirs and
assigns a parcel of Land containing one hundred acres, bounded
as follows Beginning at a post oak in Whiteheads line thence North
ward to Arthur's swamp, thence up the run to a small branch then
up the said branch to the head thence by a line of marked trees to the
beginning together with all privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging
and in any wise appertaining To have and to hold the above Premises
Parcels and premises unto him the said the said John Rawls his heirs and
assigns forever and they the said Christian Wick Pilgrim & Lydia Wick
Benjamin & Mournig Jordan & Jacob Wick for themselves their heirs
executors and administrators do covenant and agree that him the —
