This Indenture made this 6th of May one thousand eight hundred
and one between Christian Vick Pilgrim Vick and Lydia his wife
Benjamin Jordan & Mourning his wife and Jacob Vick on this
and John Rawls on the other part each of Southampton County
Witnesseth that the said Christian Pilgrim & Lydia Vick Benjamin
Jordan & Mourning & Jacob Vick, for and in consideration of
the sum of one hundred and seventy pounds current money of Virginia
on demand have given and confirmed and by these Presents do
give grant and confirm unto the said John Rawls his heirs and
assigns a parcel of Land containing one hundred acres bounded
as follows Beginning at a post oak in Whiteheads line thence North
ward to a thorn tree, thence up the run to a small branch then
up the said branch to the head thence by a line of marked trees to the
beginning together with all privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging
and in any wise pertaining to have and to hold the above Demised
Land and premises unto him the said John Rawls his Heirs and
Assigns forever and they the said Christian Vick Pilgrim & Lydia Vick
Benjamin & Mourning Jordan & Jacob Vick for themselves their Heirs
and Executors and Administrators do covenant and agree that him the
