Ball, to whom these presents shall come Whereas a certain Abraham  
 Sinkins of the County of Southampton, by his certain indenture of  
 mortgage bearing date the twenty sixth day of June 1798 did sell  
 and convey unto John Bligh and certain tract or parcel of land  
 wherein the said Abraham Sinkins then dwelt lying in the  
 County aforesaid and containing by estimation seventy five  
 acres, for the consideration and securing the payment of nine  
 pounds sixteen shillings and eight pence with interest then shortly  
 due to the said John Bligh from the said Abraham Sinkins with  
 a proviso of redemption on the payment of the aforesaid sum  
 and interest to the said John Bligh, his heirs or assigns, and Whereas  
 the aforesaid Abraham Sinkins hath paid and satisfied the said  
 John Bligh the aforesaid sum of nine pounds sixteen shillings  
 and eight pence with interest arising thereon to the date hereof  
 And know ye, that, I the said John Bligh for the consideration aforesaid  
 have and by these presents release and forever quit claim  
 unto the aforesaid Abraham Sinkins and to his heirs and assigns  
 all the right title interest claim or demand of him the said  
 John Bligh his heirs executors administrators and assigns of in or  
 to the aforesaid tract or parcel of land mentioned to be conveyed in and  
 by the aforesaid Indenture of mortgage herein before mentioned  
 and do hereby discharge the said Abraham Sinkins his heirs executors  
 administrators and assigns the aforesaid debt and demand Witness  
 my hand and seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of July 1801
