

Said Lazarus took for in consideration of the sum of Ninety Eight pounds two Shillings to the said Lazarus Cobbin hanaypace by the said Clarisy Whitehead the receipt whereof the Lazarus took and hereby acknowledge hath bargained sold and confirmed unto the said Lazarus Whitehead her Heirs &c a certain Tract of Land lying in the County of Hampton it being a part of the land that William Whitehead and wife of containing one hundred and nine Acres and bounded as follows Beginning at the mouth of the first pond branch thence up the said fish pond branch along the Woods lower line to a white oak at the head of said branch then south one Hundred and sixteen Poles to the mill branch then down the mill branch sixty Poles to a pine then north seventy six Poles to a small branch then down the branch which divides the lands formerly belonging to Mary and Mial Atkinson to 13 burns swamp then up the swamp to the mouth of the pond branch a line of lot No: one then up the branch to the Beginning To have and to hold the said land and premises with all the Appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said Clarisy Whitehead and to her heirs forever and the said Lazarus took and his wife Elizabeth took both for themselves their heirs & forever warrant and defend the title of the said Land against all and every person or persons whatsoever lawfully claiming the same or any Part and doth further witness whereof the said Lazarus took and Elizabeth took her self hath hereunto set their hands and affixed their Seals the day and year first above written.
