Will's Indenture made this fifth day of March in the  
 Year of our Lord Christ, one thousand seven hundred and  
 ninety seven. Between Simmens Vick and his wife of the  
 County of Southampton, and state of Virginia of the one part  
 and Josiah Vick of the same County and state of the other part  
 Witneseth, that the said Simmens Vick and his wife for and  
 in Consideration of the sum of Fifty pounds Current money  
 of the state of Virginia to them in hand paid By the  
 said Josiah Vick, at & before the signing, sealing & delivery  
 of these presents, the receipt whereof the said Simmens  
 Vick and his wife doth hereby acknowledge & themselves  
 therewith fully satisfied contented and peace, have bargained  
 sold, alined, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents  
 doth hereby bargain sell, aline, enfeoff, and forever confirm  
 unto the said Josiah Vick, his heirs and assigns, one certain  
 tract or parcel of land, lying and being situate in the County  
 of Southampton and state of Virginia to wit, Beginning at  
 the mouth of the Creek at the Three Cypress Bridge thence  
 across the Creek, and binding up the river, w<sup>m</sup> Woodards  
 line, thence binding the said Woodards line, and east bound  
 to the high Neck, thence binding on the high Neck  
 the said Josiah Vick's line & across from the Neck to a  
 white oak a corner tree of the said Josiah Vick's standing  
 on the bank of the Hill and the said Simmens Vick's, thence  
 running the main Road on the hill side to a Sycamore tree  
 standing in a bottom at the mouth of the Island field or  
 wheat Patch path, thence a straight line to the south  
 corner of the said high Neck thence a west course a line  
 of marked Trees to be laid off binding on the high ground  
 around the said Island field or wheat Patch to the head  
 of the Creek, thence binding on the said Creek to the first  
 station, containing Sixty five acres by the same more or less  
 in the said Josiah Vick his heirs to hath the liberty of running  
 a road through the said Sycamore Tree above mentioned immediately on the roadside w<sup>m</sup>
