This Indenture made this Seventeenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred & One Witnesseth that Benjamin Johnson & Mary his wife of the County of Southampton and Parish of Netley, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty seven dollars & Fifty Cents Good and lawful Money of Virginia, in hand paid by John Johnson the receipt whereof the said Benjamin Johnson and Mary his wife doth acknowledge themselves infinitely Satisfied and paid, doth grant, bargain and have sold, Almes and Confirmed, and by these presents doth bargain sell almes, and Confirm unto the said John Johnson his heirs and assigns, A Certain Tract or parcel of Land Situated lying and being in the aforesaid Parish, and County on the North side of the main Black-Creek containing by Estimation Twenty three acres and Bounded as follows: Beginning at a lightwood post near the road that leads to Carys Bridge, running thence a line of marked Trees to a green pine, A corner tree of Richard Blackshins & Benjamin Johnsons old line running thence North 64 degrees East one hundred pole to a green pine A corner tree of Benjamin Johnsons & Bury & Humphreys line, thence North 5 Degrees West twenty two pole to a road back at the road, thence up the Various Courses of the said road to the beginning, with all houses out houses Expences buildings yards & gardens Orchards ways waite Courses Profits hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Land belonging or in any wise
