 Southampton being indebted to Henry Barrow of the same County the
 just and full sum of one Hundred and forty six pounds six Shillings
 and five pence current money of Virginia and likewise indebted to
 William Chambliss of the same County the just and full sum of one
 Hundred and forty pounds Eleven shillings current money of Virginia
 as per Writings Obligatory thereto, and being willing and desirous, to
 secure the payments thereof have as well for the consideration of
 the aforesaid sum (So well) To Henry Barrow the aforesaid
 sum of one ^{fourty six} Hundred and forty six pounds six shillings and five pence
 and likewise to William Chambliss the aforesaid sum
 of one hundred and forty pounds Eleven shillings
 As also the sum of one dollar to me in Hand paid by Rich^d
 Clements as Justice of the said T. Barrow and William
 Chambliss the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, All the
 said Owen Myrick have granted bargained sold, and by
 these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Rich^d
 Clements the following Tract or parcel of Land lying on the
 North side of the Three Creeks and bounded as follows (To wit)
 Beginning at a pine a corner adjoining between Benj^m Barham
 and Peter Simmons thence along the said Simmons's line to a
 corner of the Estate of Howell Weyrick and John Myrick for
 thence along the said John Myrick's line to a Pine Corner of the
 Estate of Drury Parker thence along the said Parker to a
 Corner adjoining between the said Estate and Benj^m Barham
 thence along the said Benj^m Barham's line to the Beginning
 Containing Five hundred Acres more or less, To have To hold
