same and examine her privately & apart from her
husband Whether she hath executed the said indentures
freely and voluntarily without the persuasion or threats
of her said husband and whether she is willing that the same should
be recorded in the court of our said county of Southampton and
when you have examined her as aforesaid and taken her ac-
knowledgment of the said indentures that you distinctly &
openly certify us thereof under your hand and seals
returning to us also this writ and the sd Indentures annuad
Witness Sam^l Wells cler k of our said court at the Court house
the 17th day of November 1801 and in the 2^d year of the
Commonwealth —
