This Indenture made this 26th day of May 1801 Between James Browne & Elizabeth his wife of Norfolk County Virginia of the one part & Jacob Daran Jr of Southampton County & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said James Browne & Elizabeth his wife for and in consideration of a certain Sum executed by the said James Browne bearing date the 4th day of February 1799 for the sum of two hundred pounds payable with Int^r from the said thereof to Jesse Browne of the said County of Southampton against whom a commission of Bankruptcy hath since been awarded by Cyrus Griffin District Judge for the District of Virginia under an Act of Congress passed the 4th day of April 1800, Intituled an act to establish an uniform System of Bankruptcy throughout the United States
