This Indenture made this twenty seventh day of November
in the year of our Lord Christ, one thousand eight hundred and
one Between Edwin Gray of the county of Southampton of
the one part and Thomas Gray of the county aforesaid of the
other part, Witnesseth that the said Edwin Gray for and
in Consideration of the sum of Five hundred pounds current
money of Virginia in hand paid by the said Thomas Gray,
the receipt whereof the said Edwin Gray doth hereby acknow-
ledge and himself fully satisfied and paid the said Edwin
Gray, hath granted, bargained, and sold, aliened, released,
and confirmed, and by these Presents doth grant, bargain
and sell, alien, release, and confirm unto the said Thomas Gray
his heirs and assigns forever one certain plantation tract
and parcel of Land, lying and being situate in the county
of Southampton and adjoining the plantation whereon the
said Edwin Gray now resides and containing by estimation
Six hundred and twenty eight ^{acres} be the same more or less
Late the property and in the tenure of Michael Bostwick
and sold pursuant to the last will and testament of the said
Bostwick by his Executor, and Purchased from the said Executor
by the said Edwin Gray, and bounded as follows, To Wit, beginning
at a corner post Oak in Edwin Grays line, Thence South
eighty four degrees east twenty one pole to a corner post oak
Thence South thirty degrees East sixty eight pole, Thence
South twenty four degrees East thirty one and an half poles
to a stump in the Old Road Thence South thirty nine degrees
East twenty six poles; Thence South thirty nine degrees
East thirty six poles to a corner red oak standing on
the east side of the road near an old pond. - Thence down
the said pond branch the various courses to the =
