ways, waters, mines, minerals, orchards, gardens, profits
privileges and appertinances whatsoever to the said
premises, belonging, or in any wise appertaining. I do have
and hold the said tract of parcel of land with every of
the appurtenances unto the said Shadrack Boykin his
heirs and assigns forever, and the said Benjamin Branch
and Nancy his wife for themselves their heirs Executors &
Administrators, do covenant grant and agree to and with
the said Shadrack Boykin his Heirs and assigns, that
at the time of the signing, Sealing and delivery of these
presents, they the said Benjamin Branch and Nancy
his wife, hold a good right and legal authority to sell
and convey the said land and premises in manner aforesaid
and that the said Shadrack Boykin may peaceably
and quietly enter upon, have, hold & keep and enjoy
all the premises with the appurtenances about mentioned
without the let trouble or hindrance of them the
said Benjamin Branch and Nancy his wife
or any other person or persons claiming under
them and that they the said Branch and
Nancy his wife their Heirs be witnesses
