This INVENTURE made this 15<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two between William Simmons Daniel Butts Moody Collier and Michael Ellis Gentlemen trustees appointed by the worshipfull court of Southampton of the one part and Benjamin Kirby of the county a foreman and parish of Mottway of the other party witnesseth that they the said William Simmons Daniel Butts Moody Collier and Michael Ellis aforesaid hereby acknowledge and acquit and discharge the said Benjamin Kirby his heirs and assigns former and themselves therewith fully satisfied contented and paid they the said William Simmons Daniel Butts Moody Collier and Michael Ellis gent: Trustees have in pursuance and agreeable to a decree of the worshipfull court of Southampton bearing date November 1799 granted bargained sold alienated in full released delivered and confirmed and by these presents with grant bargained sell alien enfeoffe release set over deliver and confirm unto Benjamin Kirby and to his heirs and assigns for ever one certain plantation tract and parcel of one hundred acres of land be the same more or less and being all the lands whereon Benjamin Stewart did seize and possessed and bounded according to the known and reputed bounday thereof and all the houses out houses easies buildings orchards garths woods ways waterings and water courses profits commanding hereditaments and appertinances whatsoever to the same belonging or in any wise
