His Indenture made this fifteenth day of February  
in the year of our Lord a thousand three hundred and  
two between John H. Paine, William Wellons and Philip Davis  
commissioners appointed by the Honorable full court of Sessions  
at Sully court 1802. to make sale of the lands of Benjamin  
Andrews deceased of the one part and Joseph Wick of the other  
part Writeth that the said commissioners for and in consid-  
eration of the sum of one hundred and twenty pounds current  
money of Virginia to them in hand paid, have bargained  
and sold what by these presents do grant bargain and sell  
unto the said Joseph Wick his heirs and assigns for ever, one  
certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being  
in the county of Southampton being first the tract of  
land that Benjamin Andrews purchased of James Wick  
and secondly the tract of land that Benj<sup>ce</sup>. Andrews purchased  
of John Adams which said decesure duly Record in the county  
court of Southampton reference being had thereto with  
more fully appear and also show the boundaries thereof  
which said land containing by estimation three hundred  
and fifty three acres more or less was given in trust to  
Charles Briggs senior to secure the payment of certain debts in the  
said trust particularly mentioned which said trust is also  
Recorded in the court of Southampton together with all the lands  
houses woods and uninclosed swamps and low grounds with  
all and singular the appurtenances to the said tracts or  
parcels of lands belonging or in any wise appertaining  
except the woods and thirce part thereof which she is to  
enjoy during her natural life and at her death it is to go  
with the rest of the lands in fee simple to the said Joseph Wick  
his heirs and assigns forever To have and hold the said tract  
or parcel of land with all and singular the appurtenances there  
unto belonging or in any wise appertaining except the woods  
thirce a part mentioned unto the said Joseph Wick his heirs  
and assigns forever to and for the only proper use of the said  
Joseph Wick his heirs and assigns forever and the said  
John H. Paine William Wellons and Philip Davis as by Statute  
of the year of Southampton court to them directed to make  
sale of the lands of Benjamin Andrews deceased do for the
