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This Indenture of three parts made this 6 day of
October in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred

and one Between Samuel Hicks of the county of Solifright
of the first part Rebecca Turner of the county of Stampton
of the second part and William Wright of the
county of the third part whereas a marriage is intended
to be solemnized between the said Samuel Hicks and
the said Rebecca and it is agreed between the said two
last mentioned parties that if the said marriage
shall take effect that he the said Samuel Hicks
shall have possession and enjoy the use labour & profits
of the slave Jeffery and all other the property of the
said Rebecca as is mentioned specifically in a schedule
which is here to annexed so as not to deprive the s^d
Rebecca of her equal benefit of the labour of the said
Slave Jeffery and the use of the other property in the said
schedule mentioned in the lifetime of the said Samuel
and ^{also} the said Rebecca shall have power by her last will
and testament or otherwise to give devise or dispose
of the reversions of the slave aforesaid and the other property
mentioned in the schedule in such manner as the said
Rebecca shall think proper now this Indenture there-
fore witnesseth that as well for the making the said agree-
ment good and effectual and of the said intended marriage
as also for and in consideration of sum of one dollar by the
said William Wright to the said Samuel Hicks in hand
paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the s^d
Samuel Hicks doth hereby for himself his heirs executors
and administrators covenant and agree to and with the
said William Wright his heirs executors and administrators
that notwithstanding the said intended marriage shall
take effect that the said Rebecca shall and may at any
time hereafter either by her last will and testament or
otherwise give devise or dispose of the slave Jeffery and the
other property in the schedule herein before mentioned
to any person or persons or for any use intent or purpose
whatsoever and that he the said Samuel Hicks shall
and will permit and suffer such instrument to be duly

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
