This Indenture U.L.C. made this 28th day of May in the year of our Lord
1802 between Thomas Applewhite
of the County of Southampton of the one part and Thomas Potts
of the County of the other part Witnesse that the said Thomas
Applewhite for and in consideration of the sum of one Hundred
pounds current money to him the said Thomas Applewhite in
hand paid by the said Thomas Potts the receipt whereof he the
said Thomas Applewhite doth hereby acknowledge he the said
Thomas Applewhite hath granted bargained and sold, and by
these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfranchise and enfeoff
unto the said Thomas Potts certain tract or parcel of land containing
the said Thomas Potts land and is bounded as follows to wit --
Beginning at a red oak on the side of the road leading to Westbridge
in the said Thomas Potts line, thence along a new chopped line South
eight degrees west one hundred and a sixty four poles to a hickory
in the said Thomas Potts line thence with a dogwood west
forty six pole to a dogwood, thence South sixty eight degrees West
fourteen pole to a Pine, South seventy eight degrees West ninety
pole to a red oak, North sixteen degrees West one hundred and
seventy one pole to a hickory, South forty degrees west eighty four
