His Indenture made this 25th day of May in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and two between Thomas Applewhite
of the County of Southampton of the one part and Thomas Pete of
the said County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas
Applewhite for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred
pounds and money to him the said Thomas Applewhite in
hand paid by the said Thomas Pete the receipt whereof the
said Thomas Applewhite doth hereby acknowledge in the said
Thomas Applewhite hath granted bargain and sold, and by
these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfee and confirm
unto the said Thomas Pete a certain tract or parcel of land adjoining
the said Thomas Pete's land and is bounded as follows to wit -
Beginning at a red oak on the side of the road leading to Morris bridge
in the said Thomas Pete's line, thence along a new chopped line South
eight degrees west one hundred and a sixty four poles to a birch
in the said Thomas Pete's line the said North five degrees 16.15
forty six poles to a dogwood, thence South six degrees west
forty six poles to a Pine, South seventy eight degrees west ninety
poles to a red oak, North seven degrees west one hundred and
seventy one poles to a birch, South forty degrees west eight poles to
