This Indenture made this nineteenth day of July in the
 year of our lord christ one thousand eight hundred and two
 Between John Plager and Lucy his wife of the county of
 Southampton and state of Virginia, of the one part, and Silas
 Plager of the same county of the other part, Witnesseth that
 the said John Plager and Lucy his wife, for and in consi-
 deration of the natural love and affection which they have
 and do bear towards their Son, the said Silas Plager, and
 in consideration of the sum of one spanish milled dollar, the
 receipt whereof the said John Plager and Lucy his wife
 doth hereby acknowledge and themselves for the considerations
 aforesaid fully satisfied, contented and paid; have bargained,
 sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents
 doth hereby bargain, sell alien, enfeoff, and confirm unto the said
 Silas Plager his heirs and assigns, a certain piece parcel tract
 or plantation of land lying and being situate in the said
 county of Southampton in the parish of Netotway on the
 South side of Netotway swamp and just above Blonell
 Albiagton Son's mill, and is part of the tract of land that
 the said John Plager purchased of Josiah Nick called and
 known by the mill neck. Beginning at a pine just above
 the west corner of the little apple Orchard in the mill neck
 swamp thence down the run of the said swamp to Col^d Jones
 mill pond thence up the said mill pond to a pine a corner tree
 thence a line of marked trees made by the said parties is the
 beginning, containing by estimation Fifty acres but the same
 more or less, and is a part of the tract called the mill Neck.
