Orchards, woods, coates and water, courses, privileges, Hereditaments
and appurtenances ^{thereunto} ~~thereunto~~ belonging or in any way appertaining.
To have and to hold the said granted land and premises, to the
only proper use and behoof of him the said Benj.^o Blunt, and
to his heirs forever, and I the said John Blunt do for myself and
my heirs agree to warrant and defend the Right and title of
the said granted land and premises, to him the said Benjamin
and his heirs forever, free from the claim or demand, sale and
