have and do bear unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Harrison as by these  
presents make over and convey in trust to my friend Henry Person to  
hold for the use interest and benefit of my living wife as well as to  
me for my own use and benefit during our joint or separate Lives  
and for my own use and benefit during our joint or separate Lives  
one certain negro Girl named Cherry formerly the property of my  
said wife Elizabeth and to hold the said negro Cherry with all her  
increase to and for the use aforesaid by the said Henry Person in  
trust with her said increase to be subject to the disposition of my  
said wife by her last will and testament or by any other instru-  
ment in writing to and amongst her children or to any one  
or more of them as she may think proper in a such case or  
Deed will or bequest to be valid and binding so as to convey the  
right Title interest and claim of me or any other Person claiming  
any of us and to the said Negro Cherry or her increase and it is  
further declared to be the true intent and meaning of this  
Present instrument that if my said wife shall fail to make  
such conveyance as aforesaid that then the children of my wife  
Elizabeth Harrison shall all be intitled to an equal share of the  
said Negros Cherry and her increase so that neither the present  
children nor any future children my said wife may have shall  
have a right to dispossess me or my said wife during our joint or  
separate lives of the use and benefit thereof but that the same  
shall be held in trust by our friend Henry Person for during  
our joint or separate lives for the use interest and Purpose aforesaid  
said and for no other use interest or purpose whatsoever  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
my seal this 19<sup>th</sup> day of July 1802 —
