our Lord one thousand eight hundred between John Bligh and
Rhoda his wife of the County of Southampton and parish of Meo
tway of the one part and for Ann Denson of the same County
and Parish of the other part Witnesseth that the said John
Bligh and Rhoda his wife for and in consideration of the
just and full sum of ten dollars to them in hand paid by the
said Ann Denson the receipt & release of the said John Bligh
and Rhoda his wife doth hereby acknowledge and that of
