To all to whom these presents shall concern, greeting know ye
that I James Lee of the county of Southampton & State of
Virginia, believing that all mankind are born equally free &
having unalienable certain inalienable rights, to his slave
Lizzy, who he had held as a slave, do hereby manumit and set free
the said Lizzy, to enjoy her full freedom and any estate
which she may hereafter acquire from this day forward
in the same manner as if she had been born free and
do hereby warrant unto the said Lizzy her freedom so as aforesaid
granted, against the claim of all persons whatsoever in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this 18th day of October in the year 1802 — James Lee Seal

At a court held for the county of Southampton the 18th day of Oct. 1802
This act of manumission was acknowledged by James Lee the party
thereunto and ordered to be recorded

This Indenture made this 1st day of August 1802, between
Edward Wootton of the county of Sussex of the one part and Thomas
Wootton of the county of Southampton of the other part, Witnesseth
that the said Edward Wootton for and in consideration of the love and
affection he hath for his son Thomas Wootton doth by these presents
give deliver and confirm unto the said Thomas Wootton &
his heirs one certain plantation tract or parcel of land containing
by estimation two hundred acres be the same more or less being
the plantation and land which the said Edward Wootton pur-
chased of James Morris as a will appear on record in the county
court of Southampton and the reversions and accretions remain
and remainments, issues and profits, or commodities belonging
in any wise appertaining thereto and also all the estate
right and title claiming or demanding whatsoever of him the said
Edward Wootton of in and to the same premises and in any part
and parcel thereof to have and to hold unto and to the heirs
