This Indenture made this 19th day of July in the year of
our Lord 1802 Mitton with that Abraham Carr and Mary his wife
of the county of Southampton and parish of Nottoway for and in
consideration of the sum of seventy three dollars and fifty cents paid
to John and lawful Money of Virginia in hand paid by John Johnson the receipt
whereof the said Abraham Carr & Mary his wife doth acknowledge that
Monck selves infinitely satisfied & paid doth grant bargain & have sold & convey
1804 and confirmed & by these presents doth bargain sell alien and confirm
Ed unto the said John Johnson his heirs and assigns a certain tract
or parcel of Land situated lying and being in the of
said parish and County on the North side of the
main Blackcreek containing by Estimation thirty one
acres be the same more or less and bounded as followeth
Beginning at the place now called the Dam Branch for-
merly called the Hoppen Branch at the mouth of a small Brook
that discharges into said branch running thence the various
courses of said dam branch to a black gum a corner tree
in Philip Johnsons line running thence South & by the said
Ed to a white oak a corner tree thence down the said branch to the beginning
with all houses out houses buildings gardens and
ways Water courses profits hereditaments and appurtenances to the said
Land belonging or in any wise appertaining and all the profits
things estate right title property claims and demands whatever
of them the said Abraham Carr and Mary his wife for & to
the same and every part thereof and all deeds evidence writings
Touching or in any wise concerning the same To have & to hold the
said Plantation tract or parcel of Land together with the said
Abraham Carr & Mary his wife in testimony thereof
