in chancery sitting - Humbly complaining  
Sheweth unto Your Honours Your Orator  
Richard Magnard -

That sometime in the Year Your Orator employed  
Richard Matorough Esq. an attorney at law then practising  
in this court to defend & prosecute for him in the said <sup>Court</sup> ~~said~~ ~~cause~~  
the then depending in which Your Orator was either Plaintiff  
or Defendant that the said R. Matorough did attend the said  
therein his professional services for which under the  
act of assumpsit in that case made & proved & payable  
to the sum of forty five Shillings from Your Orator but more  
that Your Orator in consideration of the services above  
said paid to the said R. Matorough the sum of thirty three  
shillings leaving a balance unpaid amounting to the sum of  
twelve shillings. And now and is may it please Your  
Worshippers that the said Richard by his petition exhibit-  
ed in this court has recovered from Your Orator the  
sum of sixty Shillings & paid his Exors whereby Your  
Orator is in danger of suffering from the said unlawful  
conduct of the said Richd. to the End therefore that your  
pleat justice may be done between the parties &  
for as much Your Orator is remediless except by the  
intervention of this court he prays the commonwealth  
and of subpoena of Supplication, & that that the said  
Richard may full true & perfect answer to all the  
Matters Things herein contained. & Your Orator  
Prays &c &c

The answer of Richard Yarbrough dep<sup>t</sup> to the bill of  
Comptroler of Joseph Merviel Compt<sup>l</sup> exhibited against  
him in the Writ of Habeas Corpus of Isle of Wight

That dep<sup>t</sup> having & reserving to himself all manner of ex-  
ception to the imputations and improper allegations in the  
said Comptroler's said bill of Comptroler's Comptroler, for  
answer thereto, as to so much thereof as this dep<sup>t</sup> is accused  
is imputed, he has to make answer unto, he answering  
that, that he was possibly employed by the Comptroler  
in all the facts charged in his account upon which the  
judgment spoken of in the bill is founded, that as the  
Custom was in that Court at that time the Clerk charged  
him an extra Tax on the Comptroler's account, the sum  
this dep<sup>t</sup> alone answers against him, he says that the  
Comptroler paid this dep<sup>t</sup> thirty Shillings at different  
payments, but the balance of the account is still unpaid.

The Comptroler must well remember, that after the  
Contract of this debt, that he for some season absented  
himself for a considerable time, and since which time  
there has been no discourse between them, this dep<sup>t</sup> is  
somewhat surpris'd, that after the great indulgence  
given, that the Comptroler should endeavor to evade the  
payment of a debt, which he must know is justly founded
