Carson decd seized & sold, in the proceedings mentioned - We consider the fee simple value of Home place \$2500.00 & Battery place \$1500. and the annual value of Home place \$125. & Battery place \$100. We believe, from our knowledge (which is ^{probably} as good as that of any other persons in this County, in regard to the land & negroes in question) that the interests of the infant children of John R. Carson decd. would be more promoted by a sale of the Battery place for the payment of Carson's debts, instead of the negroes aforesaid.

That the Commissioner ascertain the expectancy of life of Martha W. Carson widow of the said John R. Carson decd.: - Reports to the Court, that, on the 30th

day of November 1857, he issued notice against the parties interested in the service of which was duly acknowledged. And posted a notice to the creditors of said estate, and all others concerned, at the front door of the Courthouse of said County, on the first day of two successive terms of the Court of said County, and at other public places in said County, informing the said parties and creditors, that he had appointed the 8th. day of January 1858, at his office at Isle of Wight Courthouse, for taking the accounts mentioned in the said decree. That a portion only, of the creditors of the decedent appeared before your commissioner and proved their claims.
