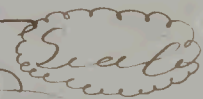

At the request of the said W. P. Young who is the administrator of said A. D. Collicote dec'd the father of said Mary E. Collicote, your Commissioner has made from proper vouchers and evidences laid before him by said administrator, the foregoing account "D" of the transactions of said Young administrator aforesaid showing that on the 2^d day of November 1864, there was in the hands of the said administrator in Confederate States Treasury notes the sum of \$12,387.³³ all of which was received by him in the year 1864, from sales of decedent's chattel estate, and is now in his hands worthless. And on the 12th day of June 1875 there was a balance due the said administrator from the estate of \$68.⁹⁵ in good currency, which as will be seen, is one of the debts proved against the decedent's estate.

Your Commissioner reports further in connection with account "D" that all the Confederate States Bonds and notes that came to the hands of the administrator, upon his qualification on the 2^d of Nov. 1863, as shown by his inventory are still in his hands and worthless.
