Answer - I know Mrs Batten has boarded Edith & Hunicutt from the 1st of January 1858, to the present time & furnished her all her clothing with the exception of a few clothes furnished by myself - I think Fifty dollars per year is as little as would compensate Mrs Batten for the support of Edith A Hunicutt - Ann E F Hunicutt has lived with & been supported by Mrs Batten from Jan 1st /58, to the 10th of May 1860 when she intermarried with Sham Jones, - except her clothing which has been furnished chiefly by myself - I think \$40.00 per year
