Yours respondent, Jas. S. Bannay,
who has been summoned to the Jury, term 1878 of
said Court under an order made at the Oct. term
1874, in the case of Wall's Exors against Gray &c,
to show cause why the land bid off by him at a
public sale, ^(made) under decree in said case, should not be
resold for his failure to pay the purchase money,
has come to set forth in writing the following cause
as why the same should not be done, viz: Your re-
spondent has paid off in full and taken in one
of his two bonds for \$1155.15^x each payable in one and
two years respectively, from 6th Dec 1869, and now has
it in his possession accepted in full by said H. D. Young.
Your respondent has also made a payment of \$734.57
on the other, and only remaining bond and the
same is credited thereon by said H. D. Young, and
your respondent is willing and ready, and has re-
peatedly offered to pay the balance due on said
bond but said H. D. Young has refused to receive the
same, and he repeats his said offer to pay said balance
forthwith if the Court will deem him a case of con-
veyance to said land on its payment. As to the mat-
ter reported to Court by said H. D. Young concerning
this respondent with that the sum of \$1155.15
was credited as money on said bond by said H. D.
Young and that just shows that he received it as
money and did not consider this respondent lia-
ble thereon, and that this respondent is entitled to pay

off the balance which appears to be due on his said
bond and to demand his due and of said H. D. Young
writes to charge him for the non payment of said order
he must do it in a separate suit thereon and not
in this proceeding. Your respondent says that in the
first instance said order was not drawn by him
in favor of said Young or Thomas & Adams but
that they, Thomas & Adams drew said order on said
Young for \$1400. in favor of your respondent which
he paid over to said Young and he accepted it.
Your respondent thinks that when he settled with said
Young and gave him said order that he, Young, drew
an order on Thomas & Adams, payable to himself
which this respondent signed at his request thinking
that it was only a matter of form. This respondent
states that said Young is required to produce both said
orders, which are or ought to be in his possession &
exhibit them to the Court. Your respondent thinks
that said order was paid to said Young about 15th
Jan'y. 1872 and to the best of his recollection the first
complaint made to him by said H. D. Young of the non
payment of said order was made at the office of Capt. Adams
on the day of the presidential election in November
of the same year, after a lapse of upwards of nine
months. This respondent did say that he would see
Capt. Adams and try and get him to pay off said
order but he did that as a matter of favor to said
Young and not because of any legal ^{liability} ~~responsibility~~
on himself in the matter. He did not assume or intend

to assume or acknowledge any responsibility in the case.
This respondent further states that he has been informed
and believes that there was an arrangement ~~made~~ ^{under}
standing between said Young and said Thomas & Adams
in regard to said order the result of which was that said
Young held said order as a pone set forth and on
his own responsibility. That he did not regard this
respondent as liable, which is shown by the manner
in which he made said credit, - that he held up
said order without any authority & for a long
time without the knowledge of this respondent. That
said Thomas & Adams were ~~in~~ ^{not} ~~at~~ ^{not} at the time of,
and for several months after said order was given.
That said order could easily have been collected had
due diligence been used and that the failure to col-
lect was in consequence of unauthorized and unreason-
able delay & neglect. Your respondent no longer
had any control over the matter or any power to
collect the money else he would and could have
done so in his settlement which he had with
Thomas & Adams on 20th Feby. 1872 in which said
order was charged to him in their account herewith
filed. Therefore this respondent insists that said loss
ought not to be assessed, but that he ought to be allowed
to pay the balance known to be due on his said bond
and to receive his due to said bond. All of which
